Mid Autumn Festival



Did you know?

The Mid-Autumn Festival (also known as the Moon Festival) is one of the most important traditional Chinese festivals, celebrated on the 15th day of the 8th lunar month when the moon shines its brightest.

It involves various traditional customs and is a time for family reunions, gratitude, and moon appreciation.

People enjoy mooncakes, light lanterns, and share tales of Chang'e and the Jade Rabbit. Dating back over 3,000 years, the festival began as a harvest thanksgiving and the same to the moon symbolising unity and completeness.

Numerous folk stories surround the festival, the most famous being the legend of Hou Yi and Chang'e.

According to legend, there were once ten suns in the sky. To protect the people from extreme heat, Hou Yi shot down nine of them and was rewarded with the elixir of immortality. However, his wife, Chang'e, had to consume the elixir after an apprentice tried to steal it. Chang'e then became weightless and immortal, ascending to the moon where she now lives as the Moon Goddess, with the Jade Rabbit as her companion.

The rabbit motif is frequently seen during Mid-Autumn festivities. Traditional lanterns in the shape of rabbits are especially popular.
